### CYBER OUTREACH

The online sex industry is booming. Our innovative cyber outreach doesn't wait for women to come to us. We've innovated a way to contact thousands of women from our community involved in the online sex industry. In 2021, we made contact with 2,960 women on-line.

### STREET OUTREACH

We served 167 women on street outreach in 2021. We have several teams, at different times of the month, spreading out all over the community to reach women in the sex industry. We offer them resource bags of food, personal hygiene items, socks, gloves, information and HOPE!

Our safe houses are operating at almost maximum capacity and the residents are making great strides in healing. Through gracious grants and volunteers, the following tasks were completed in 2021:

As the sex industry shifts and moves with technology, we are shifting and moving with it to provide services to women being exploited. Oasis House began as an outreach ministry to dancers in strip clubs and women working on the streets almost 20 years ago. At the time of printing, there are very few clubs left. Our club outreach has diminished significantly. Our street outreach continues unabated, and is in fact growing, as is our Cyber Outreach. If a woman is being commercially sexually exploited in the area, our first goal is contact. In the coming year, we hope to continue our innovative outreach programs to ensure that goal is met!

In 2022 we are excited to kick off the year with our first annual Southwest Ohio Human Trafficking Conference! We hope to provide exceptional content and host an event conducive to networking with stakeholders in the area of human trafficking. The goal of the conference is to equip stakeholders with information which enables them to better serve survivors.

Once Covid restrictions are lifted, we hope to restart our jail and prison outreach ministries. Most importantly, we are looking forward to pouring into the women we serve and spending time with our amazing volunteers.

And to the new women we'll encounter in the coming year, please join us in praying God will keep them, protect them and sustain them.
