I am pleased to report Oasis House's prosperity in 2022 was entirely due to the extraordinary generosity of our donors, event sponsors, volunteers, and partners.

At Oasis House, the heart of what we do as a community, each and every day, is to align ourselves with female survivors. We watch as they are healed, empowered, and restored from the trauma of human trafficking. I am inspired by our team as they dream big dreams and make incredible things happen to help so many women and families. This outpouring of love leads to resilience and transformation, despite the many challenges our survivors face time and time again.

In 2022, we were honored to host the first annual Southwest Ohio Human Trafficking Conference. It connected professional stakeholders, demonstrated red flags, explained facts over myths, and included sound tips on how to prevent human trafficking. In addition, we were able to host our annual golf outing at Pipestone Golf Club, and the Traffick Jam musical festival held once again at the Hidden Valley Orchards. Both offered fun-filled days and resulted in valuable resources to help continue to provide specialized services. We were delighted even further with fundraisers held on our behalf by many of our other dedicated supporters.

Some of our essential services expanded as well, including residential safe housing, advocacy, case management, mentorship, spiritual and educational classes, a survivor-led support group, street outreach, cyber outreach, human trafficking education, and awareness presentations held around the community.

As a nonprofit organization, we rely on our volunteers to help keep us operational. Last year alone, over 1,800 hours of service, by more than 500 volunteers, kept us on mission. We could not help heal, empower and restore survivors without them. Whether they provide mentorship, teach the art of making chicken soup, play a musical instrument, paint a house, or clean out gutters; we call them our "seed planters." They may not be there for the harvest, so to speak, but they bring the power and glory of God to transform the lives of the Women of Oasis House!

On behalf of the women we serve, our staff, and the board of directors, I would like to thank our community of helpers for joining the team and making Oasis House the strong organization it is today.

CYBER OUTREACH

Our cutting-edge cyber outreach strategy proactively connects us with a vast network of women. Instead of waiting for potential clients to come to us, we have innovated a novel approach that allows us to reach out to thousands of women in the community involved in the thriving online sex industry. In 2022 alone, our pioneering technique enabled us to establish contact with an impressive 2,940 women online.

STREET OUTREACH

In 2022, we had the privilege of serving 101 women during our street outreach efforts. Our dedicated teams venture out into the community at various times each month to connect with women in the sex industry. Our aim is to provide them with resource bags containing food, personal hygiene items, socks, gloves, valuable information, and most importantly, hope. We understand the challenges that these women face and it is our heartfelt desire to extend compassion and support to each one of them.







SAFE HOUSE PROGRAM



Our safe houses are essential to many survivors. It takes time, love and treasure to keep them operational. Through gracious grants and volunteers, the following tasks were completed in 2022:

COMMUNITY IMPACT

An informed and vigilant community acts as a powerful force in dismantling the networks and structures that enable trafficking and creating a safer environment for all.



In 2022, Oasis House united communities as key partners in the fight against human trafficking, educating and empowering over 1,400 individuals on prevention, identification, and reporting.

Traffickers use technology and the internet to recruit and exploit survivors.



In 2022, Oasis House contacted over 3,000 exploited women directly to offer support and resources.

Specialized trauma-informed services address issues marginalized women face. Issues include: human trafficking, poverty, discrimination, violence and limited access to education and resources.



Oasis provided over 3,000 hours of program services in 2022 resulting in better health and wellness for marginalized women in our community.

Social Media has a vast audience and ability to disseminate information rapidly, engage a wide range of individuals and communities, amplifying efforts to educate, inform, and mobilize against human trafficking.



Oasis House reached approximately 5,000 individuals a day on social media in 2022, to raise awareness about human trafficking and promote prevention efforts.

Volunteering enriches and strengthens communities by fostering a sense of unity, empathy, and collective responsibility, ultimately making the community a better place for all its members.



Oasis House volunteers empower the women we serve. We had over 500 volunteers in 2022. They serve and contribute to a stronger community by leveraging their unique backgrounds, skills, and unwavering dedication.
